1. Introduction

The Malayali Association (MA), a non-profit charity organization, was established in 2013 under subsection (3) of Chapter 8 of the Societies Act (Chapter 203), registered with the Registrar of Societies, Brunei Darussalam.

The Malayali Association is a non-profit organization representing the Malayali community in Brunei. Through various cultural, social, and charitable activities, the Association fosters unity, promotes well-being, and provides support for its members and the broader local community.

The Association's governing body, the Management Committee, consists of 17 members. As of February 1, 2025, the MA has 175 active members, including 19 new members who joined in 2023-24. There are also Four life members this year.

2. Aims and Objective.

- a) To serve as a platform for Malayalees to meet and exchange views and ideas to foster friendship, goodwill and understanding among the community and the natives as well as to help the needy.
- b) To enable the children of Malayalees to get to know one another and to learn the language, arts, and sports of Malayali Community.
- c) To engage in Educational, Social, Charity and Welfare activities and other services for those in need in Negara Brunei Darussalam with a view to return the gratitude of the Malayali Community to this nation.
- d) To do all that is possible which may be conducive to the advancement of nation building and for upholding the national prestige of Negara Brunei Darussalam.

6. EDUCATION.

a. Malayalam Classes.

One of the core objectives of the Malayali Association (MA) is to provide opportunities for the children of Malayalees to learn the language, arts, and sports of Kerala, affectionately known as "God's Own Country." In pursuit of this goal, the MA Education Club was officially inaugurated on 21st April 2024, at 2:30 PM in the Panaga Club Hall, Seria. The club's primary focus is to nurture and develop Malayalam language skills in community children through engaging activities such as reciting short poems, performing skits, and participating in other interactive learning experiences. Since its inception, the MA Education Club has successfully conducted several enriching activities designed to enhance the children's Malayalam language proficiency.



Dr. Shabanam Mary and Maneesh Jerna, Clinical Dietitian, delivered informative and engaging educational talks to the children on the crucial topic of "Eating Healthy." This presentation was followed by hands-on experimental activities, allowing the children to learn through practical application, and a short, interactive quiz to reinforce their understanding of the material.

The overwhelming positive response and invaluable cooperation from the community has resulted in a significant increase in enrollment for the Malayalam classes, with over 30 students now actively participating and benefiting from the program. This enthusiastic participation underscores the community's commitment in preserving their linguistic and cultural heritage for future generations.

b. Malayalam Club Activities.

A Malayalam language learning activity, designed to be both educational and engaging, was held at the IAB Hall in Seria on 28th May 2024. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 20 children from the community. The activities were carefully tailored to suit different age groups, ensuring that each child received appropriate instruction and support. Younger children, just beginning their Malayalam language journey, engaged in playful and interactive activities designed to introduce and familiarize them with the Malayalam alphabet.



These activities likely involved visual aids, games, and perhaps even songs to make learning fun and memorable. The children, who had some prior exposure to the language, utilized printed worksheets to practice their writing skills and learn how to blend individual letters to form words. This more structured approach allowed them to develop their literacy skills and build a stronger foundation in the Malayalam language.

c. Earth Day Poster Design.

c. Blood Donation Drive

This initiative aimed to replenish local blood banks and support patients requiring life-saving transfusions.



The drive witnessed participation from both Malayali Association members and the public, resulting in the collection of 113 pints of blood. This generous contribution will significantly aid the hospitals in meeting the needs of patients undergoing surgeries, facing emergencies, and requiring regular transfusions.

Both RIPAS and SSB Hospitals commended the Malayali Association for organizing the event, highlighting the crucial role of maintaining sufficient blood supplies, particularly during emergencies.



The Malayali Association plans to continue this vital initiative annually, aiming to broaden its reach and further promote the importance of blood donation. Through ongoing collaboration with healthcare institutions, the Association remains dedicated to contributing to the community's well-being.

9. Information

The Information Department's primary objective for 2024-25 is to effectively disseminate information to members in Brunei and India. This objective was successfully achieved through various channels. Notifications, invitations, and information received from the Indian High Commission were shared with members and non-members alike via the Malayali Association's official Facebook page, the "New MA Bulletin Board" WhatsApp group, and a dedicated Ladies' group, maximizing community reach. Time-sensitive information, such as Brunei weather forecasts, road closures, obituaries of Indian nationals in Brunei, and other relevant community news, was promptly disseminated through WhatsApp. Posters and Google Forms were utilized for event promotion to encourage greater participation.

During this period, increased member engagement was observed on the MA's Facebook and Instagram pages. The full MA Onam 2024 event was uploaded to the Association's YouTube channel, Facebook, and Instagram platforms. The Information Secretary managed the Facebook and Instagram accounts, sharing photos and videos of all MA events throughout 2024.

Furthermore, efforts were made to secure media coverage for MA events, resulting in features in the Borneo Bulletin and local Brunei Chinese newspapers.

A new WhatsApp group, "New MA Bulletin Board," was created in 2024, replacing the previously inactive MA WhatsApp group.
